OVER-40S CRICKET WORLD CUP AMBASSADORS



ALAN DAWSON

Alan Dawson was a quick swing bowler and inventive lower-order batsman who struggled to discard the label of one-day specialist before establishing himself firmly for Western Province in the mid-1990s alongside Craig Matthews and Eric Simons.

First picked for South Africa in 1998, Dawson toured the Asian subcontinent seven times in the six years. He played a crucial role in WP's SuperSport Series title in 1998-99, when he crafted 143 in the final batting at nine, and was the competition's leading wicket-taker in 2002-3. A year later, after his province won the domestic title again, Dawson was named one of South Africa's five cricketers of the year. Since retiring he has concentrated on his second career as a landscape gardener. He was named as the CSA Veterans Cricketer of the Year in 2023.

ASHWELL PRINCE

Ashwell Gavin Prince is a former South African cricketer and captain who played all formats of the game. He became the first non-white man to captain the South African cricket team when he stood in for the injured Graeme Smith in two Tests.

Prince started his career with Eastern Province in the 1995/6 South African cricket season. He represented Western Province, Boland, the Cape Cobras, and the Warriors in South Africa's domestic competitions. He has also had spells in England, first at Nottinghamshire and later at Lancashire.

In 2002, Prince made his Test and One Day International debuts for South Africa. He played 52 ODIs between 2002 and 2007, and 66 Tests between 2002 and 2011. All eleven of his international centuries came in Test cricket, in which he averaged 41.64. He retired in 2015. He is currently the batting coach for the Proteas Test team having been the batting consultant for Bangladesh in 2021/2. Prince was selected as the Over-40s Proteas Veterans captain but had to withdraw because of his national commitments.

BRETT SCHULTZ

Brett Schultz is a former South African cricketer who played in nine Test matches and one ODI between 1992 and 1997. During the course of his career, he played for Eastern Province, Western Province and Gauteng.

Schultz's fast-paced, left-handed bowling caused major problems for both right- and left-handed batsmen, evidenced by the 20 wickets which fell in the three-Test series against Sri Lanka in 1993-94, his debut tour.

Schultz made his mark on the world stage despite his career being plagued by injury. While he only played nine Tests, he added excitement and character to the cricket pitch and an air of tension for batsmen and fans alike whenever he thundered towards the bowling crease.

JP DUMINY

Jean-Paul Duminy, more commonly known as JP Duminy, was vice-captain of the South Africa Twenty20 team. He is a left-handed batsman and a right-arm off spin bowler who played domestic cricket for his home team, the Cape Cobras. Duminy made history when he was the first South African to take a hat-trick at a Cricket World Cup, which he did against Sri Lanka during the 2015 tournament.

In September 2017, Duminy retired from Test cricket after playing 46 matches between 2008 and 2017. In May 2019, Duminy announced his retirement from domestic cricket and in July 2019, he retired from all forms of international cricket. He formed the JP Duminy Foundation after retiring and continued coaching and commentating.

PAUL ADAMS

Paul Regan Adams is a former South African cricketer. A left-arm spin bowler with a unique bowling action, Adams played for the national Test and ODI teams sporadically from the 1990s. He held the ball with two fingers of his left hand (thumb, and the index finger) and seemed to be watching the sky while delivering the ball. He still managed to beat the batsmen who were prepared to use their feet against him. His first class cricket career registered 412 wickets.

He retired in 2008 and became coach of the Cape Cobras Cricket Team. He continues to coach domestic cricket and is the assistant coach for the South African u19 team.

THE INAUGURAL International Masters Cricket Over-40s World Cup brings together the best Over-40s cricketers from 12 countries and will involve 42 great games played over two weeks of intense action. Players and spectators will be treated to some excellent and exciting cricket, played on the best grounds in the region – culminating in the Grand Final at the prestigious Wally Wilson Oval at Western Province Cricket Club on 1 March 2024.

All matches will be live-streamed via Pitchvision on the Veterans Cricket Association of South Africa's YouTube channel.

The teams have been divided into two groups of six. After the round-robin group stage, the top teams from each group will progress to the semi-finals. All teams will play seven 45-over games. All matches will start at 10h15 local time and entry is free to spectators for all matches.

While the cricket will be competitive and serious, there will be a strong social element to the tournament, with some great opportunities for the teams and supporters to get together and enjoy each other's company. The next two weeks promise to be a true global celebration of veterans cricket.

Over a 15-year career, top-order batsman **James Marshall** represented New Zealand 20 times and played over 350 First-class, List-A and T20 matches. His best international performance was 161 against Ireland, which at the time was the 4th-highest ODI score for NZ. Marshall played many times with his twin brother Hamish, and the pair represented New Zealand Over-40s against Australia in early 2023, with both scoring half-centuries. James Marshall averages over 70 in domestic over-40s cricket in New Zealand, including a century in the recent IPT.

Doug Marillier scored 3 List-A and 7 first-class centuries, including a Test 100, but is perhaps best known for his innovation. In 2001, before scoops and reverse-sweeps were de rigueur, Marillier raised eyebrows by twice lapping Glenn McGrath over his shoulder for four. Marillier pulled on the Zimbabwe jersey more than 50 times, mostly at ODI level, and is a true all-rounder who can bat in the top six, bowl handy off-spin, and keep wicket.

Darren Stevens became a cult hero when, in his mid-40s, he was still dominating English county cricket for Kent. He was, amazingly, named one of Wisden's Five Cricketers of the Year as recently as 2021. In a career lasting 25 years, Stevens played almost 1000 FC/List-A/T20 matches, scoring nearly 30,000 runs and taking over 800 wickets. In his only over-40s international before the World Cup, Stevens smashed 72 from 48 deliveries against Wales.

Muhammad Farrukh played for Pakistan Under-19s and also turned out over 60 times for Karachi representative teams, with a high score of 145. He moved to the USA and has been a prolific player in masters cricket there. In his 27 over-40s matches he has scored 1344 runs at 67.20, at a strike rate of 91, and taken 48 wickets at 11.21. He moved to the USA in 2016 and has been a star at masters level as well. At the Global Cup in Pakistan in 2023, he averaged 79 with the bat and 15 with the ball.

The Canadian captain, **Vinay Kumar Devisetty**, represented Hyderabad in India for a full decade alongside the likes of VVS Laxman. He held his own in that company, too, scoring nearly 5000 runs and racking up seven centuries and 31 half-centuries, as well as captaining the side. He also played in the ICL for the Hyderabad Heroes, opening the batting to good effect, and has served as a match referee at first-class level. He moved to Canada in the mid-2010s and coached the Canadian national side from 2016–2017.

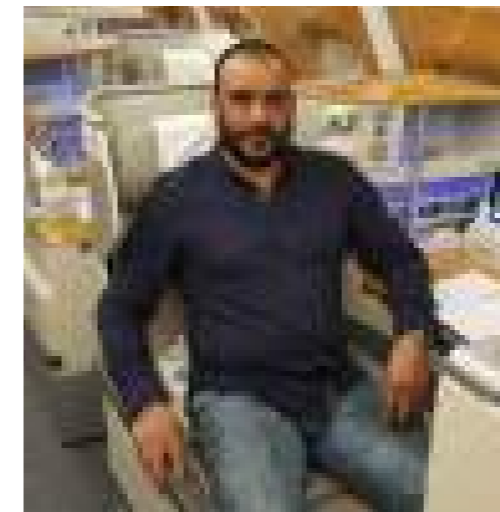

When **Gerrie Snyman** smashed 17 sixes for Namibia vs UAE (en route to 196 from 113 balls) in 2007, that was the world record for most sixes in a List-A innings. He has a penchant for records, having also scored 230 (11 sixes) in a first-class match against Kenya out of a team total of 282 – a whopping 82% of the total – and the next-highest score was 13. The hard-hitting batsman will be a vital part of Namibia's lineup, especially considering that he bowls medium pace and off-spin as well (over 200 wickets at FC/List-A/T20 level).
